We will be holding our annual assembly at *10.15am on Friday 11th November in the school hall*. Parents and carers are welcome to attend, but please be aware that this assembly is NOT

Spelling: our current School Improvement and Development Programme focus

- Children will be applying the spelling rules within everyday learning - not just for the test/spelling lesson
- Children will want to be "good at spelling" and know which spellings must be spelt correctly in their work
- Children will use a variety of IT programs to support their spelling at home and school
- Parents will have high expectations of their children re spelling at home
- Parents will be confident to support their child at home
- Spelling practice will be linked to handwriting practice
- Spelling expectations will be clear for each year group
- Staff will be confident in how to teach spelling as a discrete lesson and as part of every lesson.
- Staff will model spelling techniques to the children
- Staff will expand children's vocabulary
- Standards in spelling will improve and children will achieve ARE.

The link for this can be found on the school website homepage and your child's login details can be found in the front of their reading journals.

Work saved in their 'online work' folder can be edited both at home and in school.

There are also many excellent publishing tools for completing home learning assignments via the smart search.



As the winter months approach just a few reminders:

The school will remain open in the event of bad weather, even if we cannot provide a full education service. Historically we have had a 'snow patrol', a group of parents who are prepared to help provide childcare along with staff who live locally until all staff are able to arrive, if you would like to be added please let the office staff know;

- We expect the children to play outside in all weathers; there is no such thing as bad weather, just inappropriate clothing! By playing outside in snow and ice the children learn how to deal with cold weather.
- Our caretaking staff will endeavour to grit main routes into school but in the event that this is not possible the back gates will not be used and access to the MUGA may be restricted. We <u>DO NOT</u> grit the whole playground and outside areas.
- If the school has to close due to unforeseen circumstances e.g lack of water/heating, this will be announced on the school website and the local radio (normally Radio Norfolk)
- Please ensure that all children have appropriate outdoor clothing and that it is NAMED. In snowy weather we expect children to have a change of shoes for indoors (either changing from wellies to shoes or shoes to slippers).
