




**Year 6 Summer Term


We will continue to have our weekly spelling quiz. Your child should also be learning the Year 5/6 irregular spellings

Reading analogue clocks and converting between different units of time



Music

Pupils will continue with music lessons this term. They will be learning the cello.

Languages

Pupils will continue to have weekly French lessons throughout the year.

PSHE and RE: Pupils this term will continue with their PATHS sessions. We will also have SRE (Sex and Relationships Education) lessons later in the term.

In RE we will be thinking about the enquiry question, 'Is anything ever eternal?' Why not ask your child about this at home!

Topic: We have a very busy term ahead of us with our topic work! We will start off by studying the artists Bruce Gray and Romero Britto. We will also be consolidating our understanding of maps and the world around us in geography before moving on to studying the Mayans and more about our human body in science.
