

#### Estate Issues

I know a lot of parents and carers were concerned about being on time to pick up their child on the last Friday of half term following the terrible accident on the Dereham Road, which sadly resulted in a fatality.

Please be reassured that, although we need children to be collected on time on a daily basis, in the situation of the estate being gridlocked we will always look after your children until you are able to arrive or until you can make alternative arrangements. On this occasion we had children in the Connie Forsyth library which staff volunteered to run. I have raised my concerns (again!) with Richard Bacon MP about the "one road in/out" design of the estate and I know he is passing these on to the relevant authorities.



This half term sees the start of our whole school focus on composition within the arts. Composition is how things are 'put together' and what the ingredients of a piece of work are. In art and design composition is the arrangement of 'things' in a piece of work, including how colour, shape, line and size are used for effect. In music, this can be how sounds are used to create a piece of music, including instruments and voice. In dance, composition is how movements are combined using actions, space and
