Year 5 Summer Term 2019

'A drop in the ocean'

We will continue to focus on building writing stamina this term, with children being given the opportunity to write at length at least once per week. This term we will be working with non-chronological reports, autobiographies, play scripts and speeches. These text types will not be restricted to English lessons, but will be incorporated across the curriculum as part of our new topic: A drop in the ocean. There will be an increased emphasis on spelling and grammar skills this term too, with sessions taught alongside the Read Write Inc spelling programme. Monday spelling tests will continue, with children bringing home new spellings on this day.

Reading Masters sessions will continue to take place daily, with children reading, interpreting and analysing a single text several days. To support in the development of your child's analytical and reasoning skills, they will be asked questions such as 'What tells you that that author wanted you to feel...? and 'How have your perceptions about ... changed?. Your child's teacher will be able to offer further ideas for guestions which could be asked at home.

Maths

This term we will be focusing on measures (specifically those related to mass), negative numbers, time, coordinates in all four guadrants and data. There will be many opportunities for children to apply their learning to reallife contexts and for outdoor learning. In Mental Maths sessions, we will be developing children's arithmetic skills. In particular, this will involve the four

operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division), place value and fractions. We will also be continuing with the BIG MATHS 'Learn It' tests. As part of



this, your child will take part in a short test each week designed to help them confidence and make meaningful connections with different parts gain in of their mathematical learning. Marvellous maths will continue as well. Children need to complete at least 4 maths activities of their choosing each week and have these recorded in their Home Learning Logs. These are checked every Monday.

Home Learning

As children get older, it is still important for them to regularly read to - and be read to by - an adult. Please continue to listen to your child read and carry out maths activities like practising times tables—at least four times a week. This half term,

children will be given a choice of tasks on Purple Mash/Manga High which are to be completed by the following Friday.



PE PE will take place on Thursdays this half term. Please ensure your child has a named kit and outdoor shoes in school *every* day, as there may be instances when our timetable

needs to be changed at short notice.
