


Year 3 Spring Term 1 2020

English


Children will link their writing to the Cinderella pantomime that they attended at Norwich Theatre Royal before the Christmas break. Children will write their own adverts to persuade an audience to attend a pantomime before comparing the fairy tale Cinderella to the narrative 'Egyptian Cinderella'. Children will then adapt the story to write their own narratives.



Children will learn how to use direct speech, apostrophes for possession and subordinating conjunctions to vary sentence length.


Maths

For the first two weeks, children will be continuing to focus on multiplication and division. They will be using chunking method on a number line to divide. Additionally, they will use expanded column and grid method to multiply 2-digit by 1-digit numbers.



For the rest of the half term, children will be learning about shape, decimals and fractions. In shape, children will be drawing 2D and making 3D shapes, identifying vertical and horizontal lines, and identifying right-angles. When looking at decimals and fractions, children will be counting in tenths, adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator, and solving various problems.

Topic

Children will begin the half-term by exploring the location of Egypt and will answer the question, 'How do we rediscover the wonders of Ancient Egypt?'.

Our topic lessons will link with our writing and design technology lessons.



Design Technology

This half term, in Design Technology sessions, children will develop their fine motor skills to cut, fold and score materials to create 3D nets. Children will then design (using computing software) and create a set of square-based pyramids inspired by the Egyptian pyramids.



Music

- Les Taupes will begin to explore beat and pulse, musical vocabulary and different rhythms.
- Les Herrisons will begin Samba drumming lessons.
- Les Canards will begin to learn the Ukulele.



Sports

For those children not attending the weekly swimming lessons on a Tuesday, they will be creating floor patterns in dance lessons based around the movements of African animals.

Children will also be completing activities such as the daily mile and skipping (they will require warm clothing and trainers).



Languages

Year 3 will revise key language and vocabulary that they learnt in the Autumn Term. This will support them to consolidate their understanding of what they have learnt and build on their reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. Children will have the opportunity to practise taught vocabulary/phrases on the programme Languagenut.
