

Year 6 Autumn Term 2 2019

English

We will begin this half-term finishing our unit studying explanation texts. For the remainder of the term, we will be studying two key texts: Romeo and Juliet (Shakespeare) and The Highwayman (classic poetry). Whilst studying these texts, we will be writing newspaper reports, character and setting descriptions, diary entries and letters.



Maths

This half-term in maths we will start by studying decimals, percentages and fractions. This will include ordering and comparing fractions as well as converting fractions, decimals and percentages. Children will also become more confident solving calculations involving fractions (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and adding and



subtracting mixed fractions. In addition, we will be developing our understanding of percentages and how to find a percentage of an amount (e.g. finding 15% of 260).

Science: Volt, voltage, circuit, component, cell, bulb, buzzer, switch and motor

Geography: UK, counties and regions Computing: Code, debugging and algorithm DT: Finger food, canapé and hygiene

Topic

In French we will be studying 'la nourriture' (food) and healthy eating, as well as 'notre école' (our school). Pupils will also study celebrations at the end of term.



Science

This half-term we will be investigating how voltage affects brightness or power and how different components function within circuits. As part of this, we will be planning investigations, testing and drawing accurate electricity



Music

This half- term we will continue to have weekly music lessons delivered by Sistema. We will be taking part in digital music lessons and will learn how to create digital music using the app 'GarageBand'.



Sports

During the second half of the Autumn Term, the children will be playing and developing the skills associated with Tag Rugby. As well as this, children will continue to have their Real PE lessons once per week where children develop the
