

# Year 5 Autumn Term 1 2019

# **English**

This half-term in English we will be studying the characters and descriptions in Anthony Browne's *Voices in the Park*. We will then link with our learning in History to study a range of Ancient Greek myths. In our written pieces, the development of editing skills will be a central focus.



In Reading Masters sessions we will consolidate our skills of information retrieval, inference and deduction. Making a note of (and discussing) unfamiliar vocabulary when reading at home is vital too.

In spelling sessions, we will study the changes made by silent letters and suffixes.

#### Maths

This half-term in maths we will start by studying **number and place value**. This will include ordering, comparing, reading and writing numbers up to 1,000,000, rounding numbers and using Roman Numerals.



Following this, we will study the column methods of addition and subtraction, working with numbers of up to four digits. We will also apply these skills to solve real-word problems.

In arithmetic sessions, we will improve our fluency when efficiently solving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations. We will also build upon our times tables knowledge, making more meaningful connections with other areas of our learning.

# Key Vocabulary:

RE: commitment, dedication, devotion

Science: reflect, light source, shadow, filter

Geography: temperate, deciduous, coniferous, alpine, meridian, savanna

Computing: report, block, spam, privacy, troll, virus, settings

### **Topic**

In Geography we will be studying global climates, biomes and the affect of time zones.

Through **History** lessons, we will be learning about achievements and legacy of the Ancient Greeks.

Online Safety will be our first area of learning in Computing.

In French, we will learn some of the vocabulary related to food and hobbies.

#### Science

Light is our main science topic this half-term.

We look forward to taking part in regular practical sessions to investigate how light travels and how it is affected by external influences.



#### Music

We will continue to have our weekly music lessons delivered by Sistema.

This half-term some of us will take part in digital music lessons, where we will learn how to create music using apps. Samba drumming lessons will also be continuing.



### **Sports**

Tag Rugby and social development (part of our 'Real PE' programme) are our first teaching areas this half-term.

Please note that Tag Rugby sessions will take place <u>outside</u>.



Weekly swimming at the Norwich Sports Park - for specific groups of children - will also run alongside this.

#### RE / RSE

During Year 5 we will be studying several religions, beginning with Hinduism, where we will work with the question: *How Hindus show their commitment to God?* 



In RSE we will be exploring mental well being, with a focus on how isolation and loneliness can affect children.
