



Year 6 Autumn Term 2 2020

English

This half term in English we will be studying classic texts. We will be enjoying some Shakespeare and exploring the play: Romeo and Juliet. We will then study the classic poem, 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes where we shall focus upon the following genres: newspaper articles, monologues and using descriptive vocabulary to create mood and atmosphere. In addition, we will be using a number of drama techniques to experience imagined situations and stimulate ideas for writing. Editing will continue to remain a focus and we will be developing the skills of peer and self assessment techniques. Free Write Fridays will also continue. In our Reading Masters sessions, we will be focusing upon vocabulary choices; identifying key information; ordering main events and answering inference questions. It is essential that children keep a note of, and discuss, any unfamiliar vocabulary when reading at home.

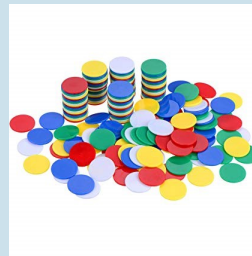


Maths

This half-term in maths we will start by studying **fractions and decimals**. More specifically we shall be learning to simplify, compare, order, add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions, as well as solving problems involving fractions.

Towards the end of the half term, we move on to multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100, 1000; multiplying and dividing decimals by whole numbers and converting between fractions and decimals.

In our arithmetic lessons, we will be continuing to improve our fluency with times tables. In addition, we will be developing our understanding of percentages and how to find a percentage of an amount (e.g. finding 15% of 260).

Topic

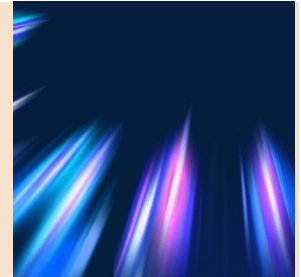
In our topic lessons, we will start by exploring coastal erosion, and what effect that has on our local community.

We will also be continuing to experiment with capturing ourselves and others in portraits in our art lessons, and will be creating gift boxes in D&T, ready for the homemade Christmas treats we will be making in food technology.



Science

In science this term, we will be exploring the forces of the world, starting with gravity. We will then move on to investigate the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, and recognise that some mechanisms allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.



Music

This term, we will continue to have weekly music lessons delivered by Sistema. This half-term we will be taking part in digital music lessons and will learn how to create digital music using the app 'GarageBand'.



Sports

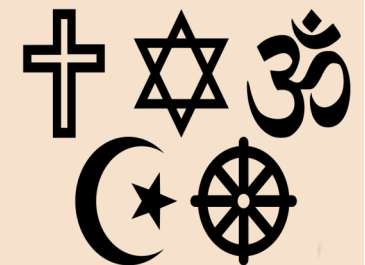
