We hope you had a lovely summer - I'm always surprised with how quickly the holidays go. Every year I let you know how many children we have on roll in our growing school. STAFF TRAINING

Whilst the children were enjoying the last of their holidays staff spent two days learning. KS2 staff have had training in grammar and curriculum development whilst EYFS and KS1 staff have had refresher training for the Read Write Inc programme which is used to deliver phonics, reading and writing skills in the lower school.

PUPIL WELFARE

One of our pupils in Year 3 was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia (ALL) last term. The good news is that she has been responding really well to the ongoing treatment which is likely to last two years.

Your child is not at any health risk but we will need to all work together to support the pupil's recovery. Chemotherapy suppresses the immune system. Chicken pox and measles are especially dangerous to children being treated for cancer. It is therefore really important that you inform the school office immediately if you suspect your child has either of these illnesses. It is also important that you let us know if there are shingles in your household.

Tinned Meat

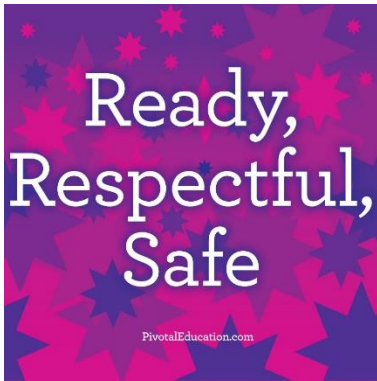
Cereal Bars

Autumn 1: Learning to be respectful in our community



Our three school rules are ready, respectful and safe; the school rules are followed by all members of our school community (children, parents and families and staff). This half-term we are going to be focusing as a school community on learning to be respectful in our school community. Each week we will all practise one of the following habits (as well as some others):

- Walking in the corridor on the left hand side
- Greeting people that we pass in the corridor
- Holding doors open for others around the school
 - o Keeping our environment tidy

Your child will also be learning more about our community and community groups that they may belong to, developing their empathy skills.

Mrs Sims will be running a Behaviour Blueprint parent session from **8:45-9:15 and 3:15-3:45 on Friday 13th September** where you can come and find out more about our school rules and how we aim to develop these skills with your child.

During the focus why not do one or more of the following activities with your child to help them to develop their respect:

Visit a local museum, such as Norwich Castle, to find out about how our community has changed over time.

Talk to your child about which respectful skill they are focusing on that week and practise together at pick up/drop off.

Visit the school library's 'Respect' display and borrow a book!
