This document will help you to review your provision and to report your spend. Under the <u>Ofsted Schools Inspection Framework</u>, inspectors will assess how effectively leaders use the Primary PE and Sport Premium and measure its impact on outcomes for pupils, and how effectively <u>governors</u> hold them to account for this.

Schools are required to <u>publish details</u> of how they spend this funding as well as on the impact it has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment by the end of the summer term or by **31 July 2019** at the latest.
