Dear Parents/Carers,

From the heartfelt messages that I have received I know how grateful you are, and I most definitely am, for us having such a wonderful staff team here at Queen's Hill School. Where some schools have had to "fold" we are able to continue to offer essential childcare for sole parents who are key workers and for double key worker parents. There have been a number of heart warming moments in the last few days: one of our dads going home to get an unopened bottle of Calpol when he heard me trying to get some for one of our mums; thank you cards from children for their school dinners; a chocolate delivery from John Lewis for the staff (and some for a few of our families too); the games donation box getting filled within two hours... I could go on!

Nursery and Reception

Nursery and Reception will continue to use Tapestry to share new learning tasks, stories and activities from the Early Years Team.

If you are having difficulty accessing your Tapestry account, please contact the school office with an email address so that we can update your account. These year groups will be using Seesaw. Seesaw is a simple way for teachers and students to record and share what is happening in the classroom. Each student will get their own login and will add things to it, like photos, videos, drawings, or notes. This can be accessed online, through tablets and on IOS and Android.

Year 6 will be issued with individual logins for a Google Classroom account. Students can sign in from any computer or mobile device to access class assignments, course materials and feedback from teachers.
