Literacy Activities	Maths Activities
Each day there will be a sound to learn or recap on Tapestry. There will also be a 'Hold a sentence' session daily.	These activities can be carried out in any order on a day of your choice.
Monday: Guess what? Today is Mrs Sheppard's birthday! Do you think you could make her a lovely card to celebrate? Challenge: Can you write a sentence describing what Mrs Sheppard could do to celebrate? Include red words.	 Jack used 20 gold coins to buy the jelly beans. Practise finding one more and one less than given numbers to 20. Challenge: can you write these as number sentences i.e 16+1=17, 16-1=15.
Tuesday: Mrs Sheppard's favourite cake is lemon drizzle! Can you write a list of ingredients that you would need to bake one? Challenge: Can you write a recipe to explain how to make one. Look out for Mrs Spicker's video!	2. Use the online tens frame to find one more and one less than a given number between 0 and 20 <u>https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/te</u> <u>nFrame/index.html</u> -Challenge: can you represent what you have done by drawing it?
Wednesday: Last week, we designed Jack a breakfast to give him strength to help him climb but what else do we need to do to make sure we are healthy and strong? What do you do to keep healthy?	 How are you going to keep track of the time when you are baking your lemon drizzle cake? E.g stopwatch, clock, phone, online timer. How many minutes does it need to cook?
Thursday: If you could design your own packet of jelly beans, which flavours would you include? Which colours would they be? What would the packet look like? How much would they cost?	 Play 'Apple Picking' with George and find the correct number to fit in the gap




