

## QUEEN'S HILL'S NEWS

Dear Parents and Carers,

I can't believe that we are already in November! The next few weeks are incredibly busy with our Remembrance Service and hopefully the usual Christmas festivities alongside the normal school events.

As the situation in Norfolk currently stands, each head teacher is able to make their own risk assessments based on the number of cases in the community, staffing situations and their school building.

I have therefore made the decision, with the support of our senior leaders, that we will try to keep things as "normal" as possible whilst also trying to protect the most vulnerable members of our school community. We will need to keep to strict health and safety guidelines and we will also ensure we have a hybrid approach for those in our community who are not able to attend larger gatherings. This means that we will continue with Show and Share assemblies and have our normal Nativities and St Peter Mancroft celebrations unless we have a large outbreak of Covid within the school.

It would be really lovely if I could be more confident about whether these events will definitely be able to take place but I'm sure you understand my hesitance!

As you will have noticed with signs in shops and restaurants, the country is currently short staffed. Our school is no different. We are experiencing a high level of staff absence with both Covid and non-Covid illnesses. This is really unusual for us, as our staff normally are able to drag themselves in - but this year, whether it is due to the illnesses being stronger, or because the staff are already so worn out from working through a pandemic, our staff are really suffering. I do ask that you

are understanding in the current climate. We are trying our very best to ensure we meet the needs of our young people, but it is not always possible to deliver the usual experiences due to Covid. We are determined that we won't need to shut the school but we do know of schools where this has had to happen.

Thank you so much to those of you that have already noticed that we are short staffed and have offered your full support and understanding about the situation we find ourselves in. It is a difficult time for everyone but I know we will find our way through it - as we always do - generally still with a smile on our face!

Your children continue to be amazing. The Y6 ambassadors are incredible and are showing such maturity. They are helping with office duties, school evaluation and generally just picking up jobs to help us where they can.

#### This is my story about my journey with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia by Mia Nelmes

It all started December 2018 with an eye infection that just wouldn't go. It then went to my legs and also a lot of nose bleeds, they could happen at any point. After after that my skin started to change to a green / yellow and I had no pink in my hands they were just white also with a lot of sickness. 6 months of constant doctors appointments my mum wasn't happy with what they were telling her and said she wanted my bloods done. They finally agreed and sent us to The Jenny Lind children's department at the hospital where it was confirmed I was diagnosed with Leukaemia. The day after I was admitted to Addenbrookes to start my treatment straight away!

The highs were my amazing team of nurses and doctors and all my family around me!

The lows were all the pokes and all the high temperatures and hospital stays then also not being able to do a lot! The medicine I was taking and having in the hospital used to make me poorly and I used to have procedures that hurt my back and my mobility wasn't great and still isn't 100% but I do my exercises to help this! It was a really long journey for me and my family but we're all so much stronger and closer now!

Ringing my bell was amazing. I've been waiting for this day for 2 and a half years. It felt amazing. My family and me were so pleased. My journey was long and tough but I'm trying to make up for all the things I missed and enjoy my life with my family and friends and get back to normal.

#### **Families in Hardship**

The Councils are currently holding funds in excess of £200,000 to assist families in hardship. These monies will be available until 31st March 2022 or until the allocation is spent, whichever is earlier. Where a school identifies that a family is in need this will be accepted by the Councils without further need for verification. Individual grants are not cash limited. Where a need is identified by a school it is proposed that the Councils transfer the monies to the school who can then assist the family directly.

Please include details of the parent and at least one of the children involved. Please specify the amount of funds required. #### Norfolk & Waveney Speech and **Language Therapy Service**





Norfolk & Waveney Children's SaLT transferred to Cambridgeshire Community Services on 2nd August making closer working with Health Visitors, School Nurses and other Healthy Child Programme

The service is being redesigned to better meet the needs for all children and young people in Norfolk and Waveney.

Agreed service priorities for the next year are:

Reducing the waiting times whilst carrying on with essential

professionals much easier.

- Joining speech and language therapy with Just One Number and Just One Norfolk so there is a single place to go for all speech and language therapy enquiries
- Developing the Balanced System® Framework for all speech, language and communication needs in Norfolk & Waveney

A new way of working in Norfolk & Waveney to support families, caregivers and professionals to develop the skills and confidence needed to support children with speech, language and communication needs. This is a long term plan, developing with framework? your support over the coming months.

We are already working actively with 2400 children, families and the team around the child. There are approximately another 1500 children waiting for advice. The Speech and Language Therapy team will working hard to reduce waiting times.
