Defibrillator

We have a defibrillator located in the school office that is available for community use during office hours. A defibrillator should be used when a person is in cardiac arrest. CPR should be done until you can get a defibrillator. There is also a defibrillator at the Queen's Hills Community Centre.

If you see someone having a cardiac arrest, call 999, start CPR and get someone to find a defibrillator. The emergency operator can advise you if you can't find one.
