This curriculum newsletter provides an overview of your child's learning this half-term	As scientists we will be learning about animals and their habitats. This will be linked to our class book Lost and Found. We will start to identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We will also find out about the human body so that we can draw and label some basic body parts.	As a computer scientist we will learn to identify the simple parts of a computer. We will find out what types of tools we can use to make marks on a screen and how we can change these to create our own pictures. We will produce our own pictures, making choices about how we create this independently.

As writers we will be writing our own stories based around the book Lost and Found. We will learn the story and retell it as a class using a picture story board. We will then change some details to create and write our own version. We will also go on an Autumn walk as explorers and write a recount of our adventures.	As athletes we will learn how to create our own dance movements and express ourselves through these moves. We will link these and make a sequence of movements. We will continue to practise some simple yoga through children's stories.	As theologists we will think about and find out about the way celebrations bring people and communities together. We will find out about the christian traditions of Christmas and then learn about the Muslin celebration of Eid-ul-fitr.

small groups. We will also read some diary extracts and answer some questions from what we have read and found out. We will explore the books Lost and Found and My Red Hat. We will talk about these books thinking about the characters and the words we hear.	As artists and designers we will find out about the artist Jasper Johns. We will explore and talk about his work. We will use his work as inspiration to explore mark making, thick and thin lines and light and dark tones. We will experiment with brush strokes and express ourselves using our new skills.	As historians we will learn about the great explorer Christopher Columbus. We will find out who he was and what he did. We will look at sources of evidence to find these things out. As geographers we will find out about Antarctica. We will learn about the environment and what makes it so different to other places on planet earth.

As mathematicians we will continue to use and develop our understanding of the part part whole model. We will explore and understand our fluency of numbers up to 5 and beyond. We will also continue to build our knowledge and understanding of quantities and make comparisons.	To understand ourselves and others we will: Find out the correct names for some parts of our bodies and label these. We will talk about when we may need help and how we can find this.	As musicians we will find out more about rhythm, pulse and pitch. We will learn new songs and sing together as we get ready for our Christmas songs performance.
