Topic: How is my local area changing?	Art and Design Technology	Geography
This curriculum newsletter provides an overview of your child's learning this half-term.	As artists and designers we will be exploring mono printing and tye dying. We will be exploring the work of Michael Brennand-Wood and using this as a stimulus for our own art designs.	As geographers we will be exploring our local area. We will be exploring how and why areas change over time and will be considering the positive and negative impacts these changes have on the environment.
English	PE	Science
In writing we will be creating a poem. Continuing with our mythical theme, our poems will be inspired by a poem called 'Dragon Song'. Our poems will include a range of figurative language features including personification, similes and metaphors and continuing to up level our vocabulary with our amazing adjectives and powerful verbs. Once they're completed, all of the poems will be displayed on the Year 4 display, and published in a Year 4 anthology. We will also be completing a cross curricular piece of writing which summarises all we learnt about 'Sacrifice' in our RE lessons.	As athletes we will be developing our running, jumping and throwing skills in preparation for our upcoming sports day.	As scientists we will be linking our geography and science work. We will be looking at the types of litter found in our local area and discussing the difference between compostable and non-biodegradable litter. We will also be thinking abut the impact of microplastics and how these can make their way into our food chain.
As readers we will be reading the book, 'The Firework Maker's Daughter'. We will be answering various questions that focus on our VIPERS skills of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explaining, retrieval and summarising.	Computing	RE
	We will be using data loggers to record and monitor the sound levels in our local area. We will also be using our photo editing skills to explore how photographs can be edited to make a place seem more or less environmentally attractive by using editing skills and cropping.	As theologists we will be continuing our work on sacrifice. We will be summarising what sacrifice means, how sacrifice is shown across different religions and what sacrifice means to us.

Maths	PSHE	Music
As mathematicians we will be beginning our half term learning about time. We will be revising key facts such as days in a week, days in a month, days in a year etc. We will be revisiting the children previous knowledge on telling the time and will be working towards telling the time to and past the hour to the nearest minute. Children will be expected to understand and use both analogue and digital clocks. We will then be moving onto division including remainders. We will be looking at division in the real world and will be solving real life problems where	To understand ourselves and others we will be thinking about the different emotions that we feel from time to time. We will reflect on when we feel different ways, what things can affect our mood and how we behave differently depending on our mood.	As musicians we will continue to have weekly music lessons with a specialist music teacher from Sistema. We will be learning how to play notes, chords and simple tunes on the ukulele.
