This curriculum newsletter provides an overview of your child's learning this half-term.	As designers we will be learning about foods from across the world and will be preparing and tasting our own food. As artists, we will be continuing with our 'food' theme by making 3D models of various foods.	As geographers we will be exploring our local area. We will be looking at how and why areas change over time and will be considering the positive and negative impacts these changes have on the environment.
English	PE	Science
During the first part of this half term we will be using persuasive writing techniques to write a speech about why Queen's Hill is the perfect area to live for a young family. We will be identifying effective techniques in other famous speeches such as rhetorical questions, modal verbs and addressing our audience directly using emotive language. We will then practise performing our speeches to an audience using loud, clear intonation. We will be ending this term with a poetry unit. Our poems will be inspired by a poem called 'Dragon Song'. Our poems will include a range of figurative language features including personification, similes and metaphors and continuing to up level our vocabulary with our amazing adjectives and powerful verbs.	As athletes we will be developing our running, jumping and throwing skills in preparation for our upcoming sports day.	As scientists we will be linking our geography and science work. We will be looking at the types of litter found in our local area and be discussing the difference between compostable and non-biodegradable litter. We will also be thinking about the impact of microplastics and how these can make their way into our food chain.

	We will be using data loggers to record and monitor the sound levels in our local area. We will also be using our photo editing skills to explore how photographs can be edited to make a place seem more or less environmentally attractive by using editing skills and cropping.
