As athletes we will: ★ Be applying our physical skills to learn about athletics in readiness for sports day.	As scientists we will: ★ Observe and compare plants. We will learn what the different parts of a plant are called, where we might find wild and garden plants and name some common plants.

As readers we will: ★ Continue to learn our key phonics sounds and blend them to read unfamiliar words. ★ Increase our speed and accuracy when reading. ★ Become familiar with key stories, fairy tales and traditional tales and consider the key characteristics of these types of stories.	As theologists we will: ★ Reflect on what we have learnt over the last year and think about what it means to us individually.	As geographers we will: ★ Name and locate all four of the UK countries and its surrounding seas. The children will be able to say where they live and what country they are from.
